## **DS-I Africa Project Spotlight**:

#### Advancing discovery for developmental disorders – expanded analysis of the DDD-Africa

Are you aware of the innovative ways <u>DS-I Africa</u> utilzes data science (DS) to advance the discovery of developmental disorders? This month's newsflash highlights an exciting DS-I Africa initiative applying data science on clinical information, genetic data, and DNA resources to investigate developmental disorders.

Developmental disorders (DD) represent a spectrum of often severe disabilities that are present from birth or early childhood. The Deciphering Developmental Disorders in Africa study (DDD-Africa) was started to describe and define the causes of DD in Africa, and this resource holds the potential for much more discovery, using data science- and omics techniques.

The overall goal of the <u>DDD-Africa Project</u> is to advance our knowledge, we propose to use the clinical information, genetic data, and DNA resources from the DDD-Africa study to increase diagnostic yield and make new discoveries about the causes of DD in African patients.

The <u>DDD-Africa Project</u> led by Prof. Zane Lombard seeks to ensure that the findings will lead to population-relevant and scalable solutions for Africa, fast-tracking genomics efforts for global health.benefit other ethnicities regarding disease etiology and potential therapeutic strategies.

Funding Opportunity RFA-CA-24-016 from the NIH Guide for Grants and Contracts. The purpose of this Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) is to invite exploratory/developmental research grant applications (R21) for innovative informatics methods and algorithms to improve the acquisition, analysis, visualization, or interpretation of data across the cancer research continuum including cancer biology, cancer treatment and diagnosis, early cancer detection, risk assessment and prevention, cancer control and epidemiology, and/or cancer health disparities. As a component of the NCI's Informatics Technology for Cancer Research (ITCR) Program, the emphasis of this FOA is on supporting the development of novel informatics capabilities that involve a high degree of innovation that have the potential to accelerate or enhance research. To be successful, there must be a clear rationale for how the proposed informatics method or algorithm is novel and how it will benefit the cancer research field. Projects proposing the application of existing methods or algorithms where the novelty resides in the biological or clinical question being pursued are not responsive to this solicitation and will not be reviewed.

The DS-I Africa Coordinating Center announce that the DS-I Africa and H3Africa have been selected to host a classroom for the **online course**, <u>UW Policy Development and Advocacy for Global</u> <u>Health</u> presented by the Department of Global Health eLearning Program at the University of Washington.

Start date: The course starts on 30 September 2024 and ends on 8 December 2024.

IMPORTANT! Enrolment is voluntary. #### **Course fee**

Only USD 20 per person. Payment is due 23 August 2024.

The site cost is USD 1750 for a max. 50 participants. Fees are subsidised by DS-I Africa/H3Africa Coordinating Centres and participant fees will be used to cover certificate courier costs. This fee is minimal - should you choose to enroll as an independent participant (not associated with a site) this course fee will start at USD 200.

#### \*updated Grant Writing Workshops for Researchers in West Africa

NIAID and the Government of Ghana are collaborating to convene a series of grant writing workshops for researchers in West Africa. The workshops aim to teach West African investigators best practices for writing and submitting grant proposals to the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

Phase I of the workshop will consist of three virtual training sessions in May 2024 which are open to everyone. Individuals who have attended Phase I are then eligible to apply to participate in Phase II and III, which include additional virtual trainings (Phase II) and a four-day, in-person workshop in Accra, Ghana in August 2024 (Phase III).
